This award recognises organisations that have achieved positive change and contributed to community development in their local or wider community.

Award description

The nominee will be a group who has worked together to make a vital contribution to improving communities for example from a social, economical or environmental perspective. The nominee's work and achievements could be in the empowerment of:

- » Geographical communities
- » Communities of interest or identity and
- » Communities organising around specific themes or policy initiatives.

Who is eligible?

- » Volunteer Groups
- » Community Groups
- » Tenants and Residents Associations or Groups
- » Federations or Umbrella Organisations
- » Campaign Groups
- » Action Groups

Who can make the nomination?

- » The group themselves
- » An individual from the community
- » A support worker working with the group
- » A member of staff from the housing organisation
- » An Elected Member or member of the Governing Body from the housing organisation
- » A local agency

How will the nomination be judged?

- » An independent judging panel will consider the nomination against the award criteria
- » Each question lists the award criteria
- » Make sure all questions are answered as fully as possible against the criteria
- » Keep your nomination concise and focused
- » Do not exceed the maximum word count
It is okay to use bullet points or lists
- » Include substantial evidence in your nomination submission
- » Submit supporting evidence if it helps to support your nomination submission

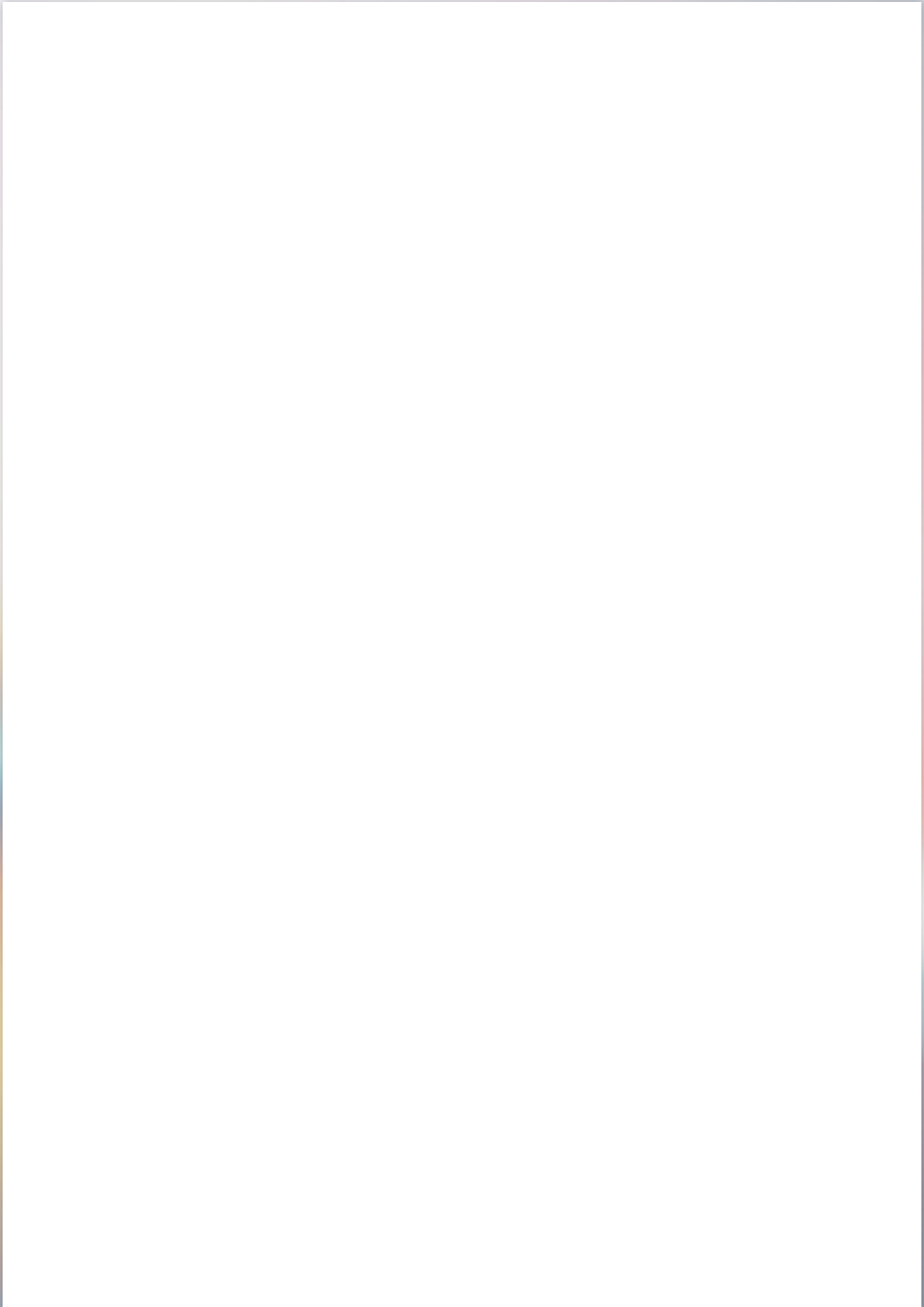
