



Most Inspiring Scrutiny Group Award 2018

This award recognises excellence in scrutiny practice that others can learn from and that will inspire future tenant scrutiny development. It will recognise the outstanding contribution of a scrutiny group who has created outstanding improvements for tenants and service users in the delivery of housing services.

Award description

The nominee will be a motivated and committed group of tenants and service users who has worked in partnership with a housing organisation to make an outstanding contribution towards influencing housing services, performance improvement and ensuring that scrutiny is embedded within the strategic direction of the organisation.

Who is eligible?

- » Scrutiny Panels, Scrutiny Groups, Mystery Shopping Projects, Tenant Led Inspection Projects
- » Tenants and/or Residents Organisation working in scrutiny
- » Community Groups working in scrutiny

Who can make the nomination?

- » A member of the group
- » A support worker working with the group
- » A member of the housing organisation's staff
- » A member of the housing organisation's Governing Body
- » A local agency

How will the nomination be judged?

- » An independent judging panel will consider the nomination against the award criteria
- » Each question lists the award criteria
- » Make sure all questions are answered as fully as possible against the criteria
- » Keep your nomination concise and focused
- » Do not exceed the maximum word count
It is okay to use bullet points or lists
- » Include substantial evidence in your nomination submission
- » Submit supporting evidence if it helps to support your nomination submission
